What inspires you?

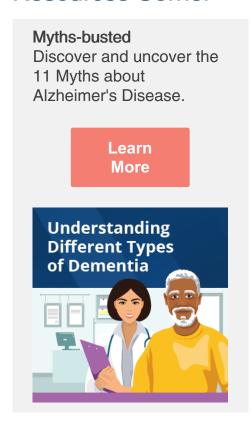

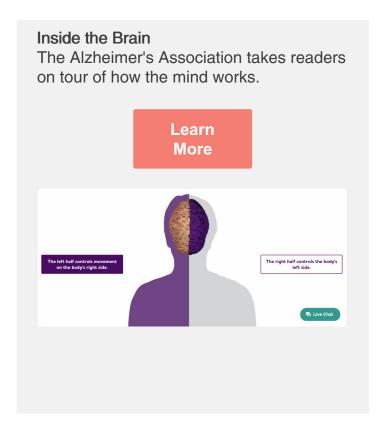
